This information booklet is designed to provide you with essential details about the Wombat Room and our approach to childcare for children aged 18 months to 2.4 years old.

The Wombat Room focuses on creating a nurturing environment that promotes social, emotional, and cognitive development. Our dedicated team of educators strives to provide a safe and stimulating atmosphere where your child can explore, learn, and grow.

Safe and Comfortable Environment

Our room is designed to provide a secure and inviting space where children feel safe and at ease.

Experienced and Caring Staff

Our team of educators are experienced and passionate about early childhood development, ensuring your child receives the best care and attention.

Play-Based Learning

We believe in the power of play as a fundamental tool for learning. Play-based learning is an approach where children engage in activities that are enjoyable and meaningful, fostering creativity, curiosity, and a love for exploration.

What is Play-Based Learning?

Play-based learning involves activities that are child-directed, allowing them to explore, experiment, and discover at their own pace. It includes both structured and unstructured play, incorporating elements like imaginative play, sensory experiences, and problem-solving.

The Importance of Play-Based Learning:

- *Cognitive Development:*
Play stimulates brain development, enhancing memory, language skills, and cognitive abilities.
- *Social and Emotional Growth:*
Through play, children learn to share, cooperate, and navigate social relationships, fostering emotional intelligence.
- *Motor Skills:*
Activities like stacking blocks or crawling contribute to the development of fine and gross motor skills.
- *Curiosity and Creativity:*
Play encourages curiosity, imagination, and creativity, laying the foundation for a love of learning.

Teaching Respect and Values

Our curriculum includes lessons on respect, kindness, and values to instill positive behaviour and social skills in every child.

- *Respecting People*
In the Wombat Room, we introduce age-appropriate concepts of respect towards peers, educators, and the broader community. Through activities like sharing, taking turns, and group play, children learn to understand and appreciate the feelings and perspectives of others.
- *Respecting the Environment*
We instill a sense of environmental responsibility in our little ones by incorporating activities that teach them about caring for the world around them. Simple tasks, such as picking up toys and recycling, are introduced to promote a sense of responsibility towards the environment.
- *Respecting Aboriginal Land of Australia*
We acknowledge and respect the rich cultural heritage of Australia's Aboriginal people. Age-appropriate discussions and activities are woven into our curriculum to introduce children to the traditional custodianship of the land. This includes learning about native animals, plants, and engaging in art activities inspired by Aboriginal culture.
- *Linking to Sustainability*
Even at this young age, children can begin to understand the importance of sustainability. Through play-based activities like planting seeds, watering plants, and sorting recyclables, we foster a connection to nature and teach the basics of caring for the planet. Our focus is on instilling values that will contribute to a sustainable future.

Educators

Our Planning

In the Wombat room, we create intentional and engaging learning environments. We purposely and thoughtfully set up learning experiences under these key learning areas;

- Dramatic play
- Sensory
- Construction
- Art/collage
- Reading area
- Nature/Sustainability/Outdoor

Importantly: at this age we are following each individual's routine from home and encourage their developing motor skills and support their emotional development.

When planning, educators set specific goals related your child's age and stage of development. With this knowledge, educators plan intentional teaching moments to scaffold your child's learning.

At the end of each term, an individual observation planning record will be emailed to you with your child's individual goals under one or more of the following areas:

- Community (Social)
- Identity (Emotional)
- Learning (Cognitive)
- Communication (Language)
- Wellbeing (Physical)

Under the area/s, educators will document what they have observed, the goal they want your child to achieve, the intent and strategies the educators will put in place to assist your child to achieve this goal and a reflection of how your child is progressing with the goal. Remember everyone learns and develops at different stages, your child might not achieve their goal in the first term and that is ok. Our planning enables children to learn and develop at their own pace. If there is anything you would like your child to learn or focus on, please feel free to speak to educators in the room.

Our Routine

Our routine is very flexible, as it is based around each child's individual routines and rituals.

- 7:30 am Family Grouping commences in the Wombat Room (Breakfast served until 8:00 am)
- 8:45 am Wombats transition into their room program – Indoor/outdoor
- 9:00 am Morning Tea
- 10:00 am Outdoor program (weather permitting). Nappy changes.
- 11:00 am Transition to lunch time (Menu displayed in room)
- 11:30 am Prepare children for sleep/rest time.
- 01:30 pm Nappy changes, indoor/outdoor program
- 03:00 pm Afternoon tea (varying: sandwiches/crackers/scones/fresh fruit etc)
Prepare children for outdoor play (unless already outdoors)
- 03:30 pm Indoor/Outdoor Program
- 04:00 pm Indoor/Outdoor play continues.
Nappy changes.
- 05:15 pm Kinder House children join us family grouping.
- 06:00 pm Centre Closes.



General Housekeeping

Sign in and out

Please remember to sign your child in and out each day (via iPad)

Clothing

Please ensure your child is dressed for fun and exploration when at Gum Nut. We recommend you do not send your child in clothes you don't want them to get paint or dirt on. Please pack SPARE clothes (pants, t-shirt, socks) in case of messy play or nappy accidents. Remember cool clothes for summer and a jacket & beanie for winter. All clothing items should be clearly labelled. (Appropriate shoes for outdoor play)

Nappies

Please ensure your child has a minimum of 6 nappies on the days your child attends Gum Nut & if you could please leave them in your child's bag or place them on the shelf labelled.

Meals

Breakfast, morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea are provided by Gum Nut. It is our preference children are eating lunch from Gum Nut only, unless for a particular dietary reason you have to supply your own food.

Anaphylaxis/Allergies/Asthma

All medication must be left at Gum Nut with appropriate action plan from a doctor/specialist. Please see Educators if this applies to you. Your child cannot and will not be accepted without the proper medications, plans etc.

Hats

Please ensure your child has an appropriate sun hat – (wide brim or legionnaires) clearly labelled. Please note you can leave a hat here in the hat pockets located in the hallway. No Hat - No Outdoor Play

Sunscreen

Please ensure you have applied sunscreen on your child prior to attending the centre. The Wombat educators will apply more sunscreen on your child, throughout the day with our centre's sunscreen, unless due to allergies you can supply your own.

Water & Milk Bottles/Sipper Cups

Must be clearly labelled and brought to Gum Nut on the days your child attends, then taken home at the end of the day to be washed and returned.

If your child is drinking cow's/alternative milk from the centre, please be advised because of health and cross contamination, we would like it if you could provide your own sipper cup.

If you are bringing breast milk, please label it and place it in the fridge on arrival each day. (please provide an insulated bag)

Parent Communication

We communicate weekly updates on your child's activities and upcoming plans through our private Facebook group. Additionally, room and center events will be shared via both Facebook and email. For daily activities, a dedicated board in the room will keep you informed.

Emails

Please check this often and keep us informed of email changes. Wombat email address is for planning purposes only, any other information (e.g. change of days, illnesses etc must be emailed to Office)

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
